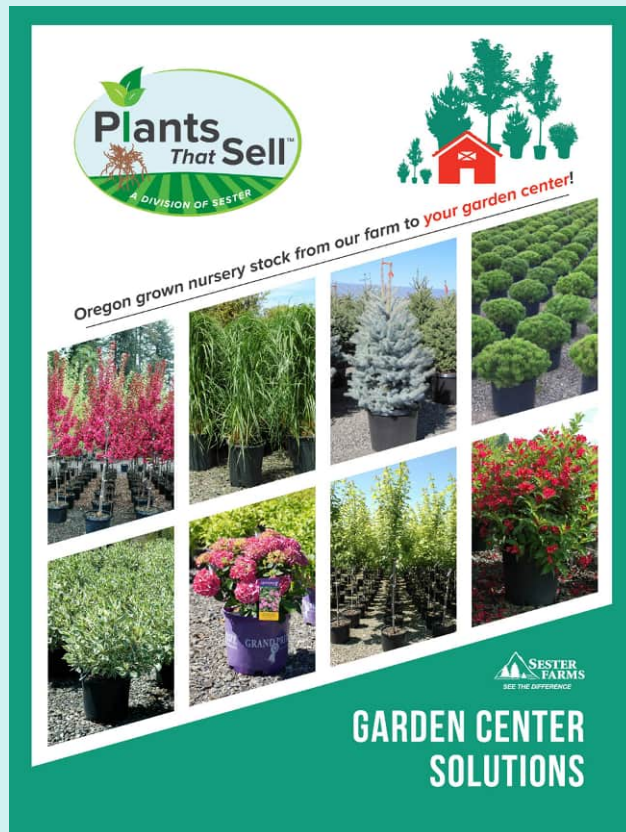

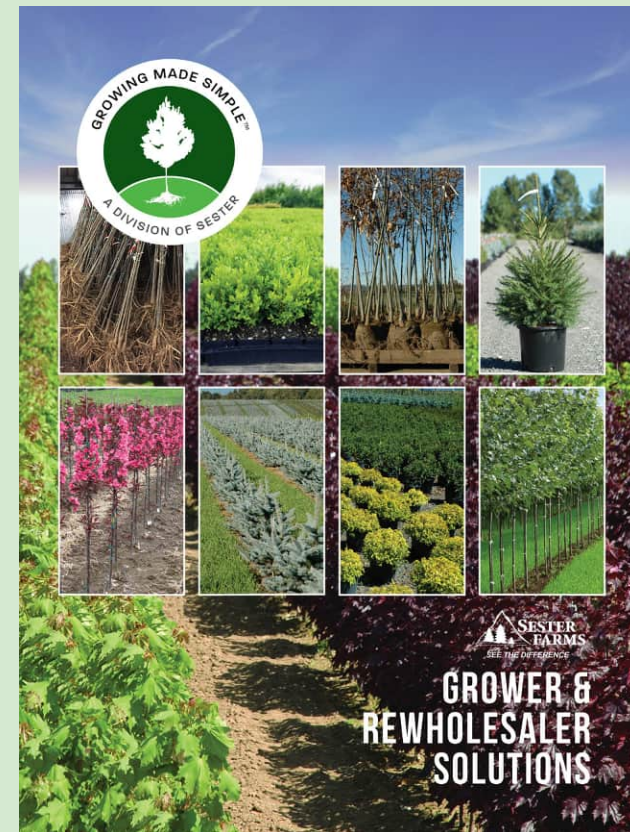

Container Spruce

Blue Chip Juniper

Canaan Fir

Abies balsamea phanerolepis



◆ Height 55' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 4

A medium-sized tree with a dense, pyramidal crown. Needles are medium to dark green on the top, and silverish-blue on the underside. A durable tree that grows well in many different soil conditions. Resembles Fraser and balsam fir in growth and appearance.

Concolor Fir

Abies concolor



◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 3

Also commonly called White Fir. Pyramidal, rigid form. Has soft, silver-blue needles and ash-grey bark. Thrives in full sun with well-drained soil.

North Dakota Concolor Fir

Abies concolor 'North Dakota'



◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 3

Tall and stately, this silvery blue-green fir is native to the mountains of the West from Canada to Mexico. It prefers full sun, moist soil and cool summers, but amazingly survives drought, heat, poor compacted soils and stressful city conditions. Brings a straight vertical silhouette to your landscape as well as welcome color in winter.

Blue Atlas Cedar

Cedrus atlantica 'Glauca'



◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 6

Beautiful silvery-blue colored needles has a bold, pyramidal form. One of the most popular evergreen conifers. Spectacular for large landscape areas.

Weeping Blue Atlas Cedar

Cedrus atlantica 'Glauca Pendula'



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 6

This cascading curtain of icy blue might go up, down, sideways or every which way. Definitely the most dramatic, architectural tree available, and you can get creative by leading the steely blue branches any way you will. It looks great spilling over a boulder or retaining wall, or trained up a pergola or along a fence. Eye-catching for your friends and neighbors, but most pests and diseases stay away.

Deodar Cedar

Cedrus deodora



◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 7

The national tree of Pakistan and appreciated by all cultures for its graceful, pendulous branches and bluish hues. This stately conifer is fabulous on a spacious lawn or as a sizable screen, and the best large specimen for warmer North American climates. Called the California Christmas Tree, it even decorates itself with handsome cones. When established it tolerates heat, drought, sea winds and is basically trouble-free.

Blue Alaska Cedar

Chamaecyparis nootkatensis 'Glauca'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 8' ◆ Zone 5

This is a tall, narrow evergreen with pendulous branches providing an overall graceful appearance. The rich blue color and weeping effect make it a stunning specimen or vertical accent plant.

Blue Weeping Alaska Cedar

Chamaecyparis nootkatensis 'Glauca Pendula'



◆ Height 35' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 5

A large but graceful tree with weeping branches and blue-green foliage. Fast growing. This cedar can be used effectively as a great screen or specimen tree.

Compact Hinoki Cypress

Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Compacta'

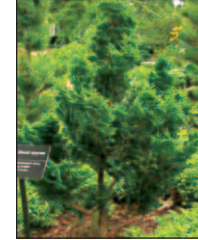


◆ Height 10' ◆ Spread 4' ◆ Zone 4

Irregular and undulating upright conifer is easy to grow and its dark green foliage looks great in every season. Vigorous, yet stays compact and refined. Unperturbed by most pests and diseases, but would appreciate protection from cold, drying winds. Tolerates urban conditions.

Dwarf Hinoki Cypress

Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Nana Gracilis'



◆ Height 3' ◆ Spread 3' ◆ Zone 5

This dwarf conifer has golden yellow foliage. Excellent in a rock garden or in beds. A irregular globe-shape brings a unique look to the landscape.

Verdoni Hinoki Cypress

Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Verdoni'

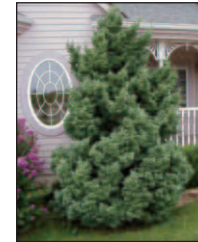


◆ Height 5' ◆ Spread 3' ◆ Zone 5

Enliven your garden with this vivid golden pyramid which amazingly does not burn when planted in full sun. Very dependable and low maintenance, its irregular growth doesn't exceed its selected space. In winter Verdoni takes on shades of orange and bronze, while new spring growth is bright yellow. Tolerates air pollution, but prefers a cool climate.

Boulevard False Cypress

Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Boulevard'



◆ Height 10' ◆ Spread 4' ◆ Zone 4

Soft and fluffy steel blue foliage with silver stripes makes this conical conifer a remarkable accent in your landscape. Or plant several in a hedge or screen. Boulevards are happy with part shade, hot temperatures, urban pollution, and don't mind if you topiary them. When exposed to winter winds they will take on a bronze hue, so you may want to shelter them.

Blue Ice Arizona Cypress

Cupressus arizonica glabra 'Blue Ice'



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 6

Dazzling icy silver blue clouds of foliage make this a standout focal point in any garden. Give it the bright sun and well drained soil of its native Arizona and it will provide a cooling view in summer and exquisite decor for winter. In hot, dry climates Blue Ice is a fabulous hedge, windbreak or screen, perfect for xeriscaping. It resists deer, insects and diseases.

Angelica Blue Juniper

Juniperus chinensis 'Angelica Blue'



◆ Height 3' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 3

This densely branched spreading juniper is a brilliant powder blue and holds its stylish color throughout the winter. More compact than some Pfitzer-type junipers, it grows quickly and easily even under very difficult conditions. Plant it amongst dark green conifers for a stunning color contrast. Deer resistant.

Blue Point Juniper

Juniperus chinensis 'Blue Point'

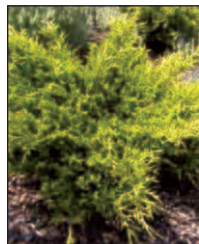


◆ Height 10' ◆ Spread 4' ◆ Zone 4

A charming tear drop shape sets Blue Point apart from other pyramidal shrubs. Its glowing blue-green hue is attractive year round and earns its place as a lawn specimen or vertical accent flanking doorways or driveways. In hot climates it is favored for windbreak and privacy screens, in cold climates it brightens the winter landscape. The form is maintained with minimal shearing, but it can be topiaried or spiraled.

Old Gold Juniper

Juniperus chinensis 'Old Gold'

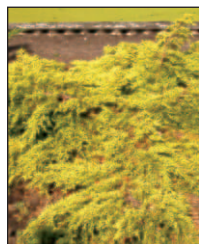


◆ Height 3' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 4

This graceful arching gem deserves its name. The bronze-gold coloring, brightest during the warmest months of the year, holds well through the winter. Easy to maintain, it tolerates deer, rabbits, dry or shallow, rocky soil, salt spray and air pollution. Good as a low hedge, large foundation plant, for erosion control on banks, or colorful accent, but don't let its feet get wet.

Gold Pfitzer Juniper

Juniperus chinensis 'Pfitzeriana Aurea'

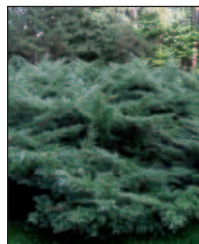


◆ Height 6' ◆ Spread 9' ◆ Zone 4

A very tough and versatile variety of Pfitzer juniper. Used in lots of landscapes. Slightly arched branches that are a nice bright green and yellow-gold. Used in a hedge or along fences or in front of buildings. Looks good shaped or trimmed.

Blue Pfitzer Juniper

Juniperus chinensis 'Pfitzeriana Glauca'

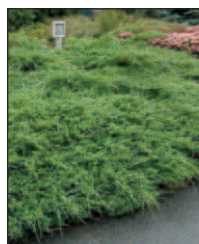


◆ Height 6' ◆ Spread 12' ◆ Zone 4

A fountain of silvery blue foliage which will withstand the absolute harshest conditions. Allow it room to spread its delicate appearing, arching branches and it will look good while serving as a screen, hedge, slope stabilizer, or large foundation planting. Will grow in any soil except wet, and makes a great barrier to undesirable visitors. Can be topiaried or pom-pom poodled.

Sea Spray Juniper

Juniperus chinensis 'Sea Spray'



◆ Height 18" ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

The soft, blue-green foliage sprays out from this plant like a splashing ocean breaker. The texture looks delicate but this very tough juniper can handle urban pollution, humidity, salt spray, wind, heat and cold. Best of all, Sea Spray resists diseases that can sometimes plague other junipers.

Spartan Juniper

Juniperus chinensis 'Spartan'



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 4' ◆ Zone 4

This juniper is very dense and fast growing with a narrow, columnar growth habit. It tapers slightly from base to its point making it an ideal screen or topiary specimen. No trimming or pruning is needed but it will react well to shaping, if used as topiary. The foliage is a rich green all year round.

Bar Harbor Juniper

Juniperus horizontalis 'Bar Harbor'

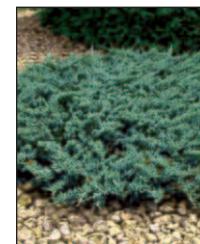


◆ Height 1' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 3

Bar Harbor is native to the windy, sandy, and rocky coastline of eastern North America, and thus is superb at stabilizing slopes too steep for lawns. Also excellent as a ground cover near city streets and sidewalks since it doesn't mind heat, poor urban soils, pollution, or wintry salt spray. Great for xeriscaping! In cold climates it will take on plum purple tones in winter.

Blue Chip Juniper

Juniperus horizontalis 'Blue Chip'



◆ Height 1' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

A top quality ground cover for cold climates displaying silver-blue foliage on a widely spreading habit. The foliage retains its rich color all year long. Steel blue foliage takes on a hint of purple in winter. Once established needs only occasional water.

Hughes Juniper

Juniperus horizontalis 'Hughes'



◆ Height 1' ◆ Spread 8' ◆ Zone 3

An attractive, evergreen ground cover for color accent in the landscape, featuring silvery-blue foliage all season long. This low maintenance, ground hugging accent plant is wide spreading and gives a fine and delicate texture. Graceful branches are attractive cascading over rocks or walls.

Andorra Compact Juniper

Juniperus horizontalis 'Plumosa Compacta'



◆ Height 2' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

This well-behaved, mounding ground cover Juniper displays feathery bluish-green foliage in summer that turns bronze plum for winter. Will grow in shallow, rocky soil on windy slopes, coastal hillsides, or dry city sites. Bugs, rabbits and deer usually ignore it.

Prince of Wales Juniper

Juniperus horizontalis 'Prince of Wales'



◆ Height 8" ◆ Spread 7' ◆ Zone 3

A popular evergreen ground cover featuring bright green foliage which takes on a purple cast in winter. Ground-hugging, extremely adaptable and hardy, it is ideal for trailing over walls. Dense but with a delicate texture, it tends to fill out right to the ground. Adaptable to both dry and moist conditions.

Dwarf Japanese Garden Juniper

Juniperus procumbens 'Nana'



◆ Height 1' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 4

Dependable and incredibly attractive ground cover, especially flowing around decorative rocks, in Asian gardens, and spilling over retaining walls. It is perfectly content growing in dry, sandy, or shallow, rocky soil; just don't plant it in a wet area. Neither heat nor cold, deer nor rabbits will faze this juniper. Fun to train as a bonsai or topiary.

Blue Arrow Juniper

Juniperus scopulorum 'Blue Arrow'

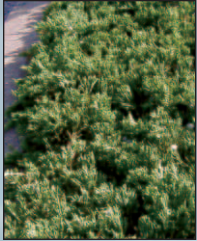


◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 2' ◆ Zone 3

Outstanding blue-green foliage and an easy to grow nature makes this narrow, upright juniper a valuable landscape plant. It is drought and deer resistant and can easily tolerate seashore and roadside salt conditions. Fall berries are a favorite of native songbirds.

Blue Rug Juniper

Juniperus horizontalis 'Wiltonii'

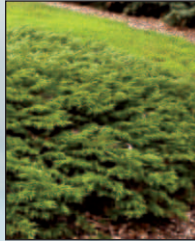


◆ Height 6" ◆ Spread 7' ◆ Zone 3

A trailing juniper with a uniform, full centered growth habit. The foliage is an intense, silvery-blue color. Fast growing to 6" tall, it is excellent for covering large areas. The foliage turns slightly purple in the cold months. Attracts birds, deer resistant and waterwise.

Calgary Carpet Juniper

Juniperus sabina 'Monna'



◆ Height 9" ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 3

A superior groundcover with a very low, spreading growth habit and attractive, soft green foliage. It is useful in perennial borders, mass plantings and along walkways. This variety is extremely durable and hardy, tolerating heat, drought and cold.

Moonglow Juniper

Juniperus scopulorum 'Moonglow'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 8' ◆ Zone 3

Exceptionally showy, silvery blue foliage and a broad pyramidal form make this an ideal selection as an accent plant, screen or hedge. This tough plant has a dense, compact branching habit which resists grazing by deer. The foliage color becomes even more intense in cold weather.



Sky Rocket Juniper

Juniperus scopulorum 'Sky Rocket'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 3' ◆ Zone 3

Stately, columnar form makes this probably the narrowest juniper available, resembles a skyrocket. Durable and versatile, best grouped to form a colorful screen or garden accent.

Blue Star Juniper

Juniperus squamata 'Blue Star'



◆ Height 2' ◆ Spread 3' ◆ Zone 4

A slow growing juniper, with silvery-blue foliage that forms a low compact mound. Established plants are drought tolerant making this striking blue juniper a low maintenance option for many landscape needs. Does best in full sun, but will tolerate some shade.

Weeping European Larch

Larix decidua 'Pendula'



◆ Height 20' x 4' ◆ Zone 3

A deciduous conifer. Fast growing and narrow, it is upright when young, with graceful, weeping branches which widen with maturity. Bright green needles turn golden in autumn.

Wichita Blue Juniper

Juniperus scopulorum 'Wichita Blue'



◆ Height 18' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 3

An upright juniper with brilliant, blue foliage and a neat, pyramidal form. The compact, upright growth habit make it ideal for use as a focal plant, hedge or screen. Shear it yearly to give a more formal appearance.

Gold Coast® Juniper

Juniperus x pfitzeriana 'Aurea Improved'

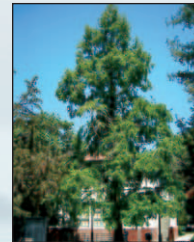


◆ Height 3' ◆ Spread 4' ◆ Zone 4

A great choice for brightening up drab winter landscapes, Gold Coast's chrome yellow new growth only intensifies in the frigid months. Its arching, lacy but tough foliage is perfect for rock gardens, and as a tall, spreading ground cover it will deter foot traffic. Very heat tolerant, and can take partial shade in the hottest climates. Can be topiaried or left naturally rounded.

Dawn Redwood

Metasequoia glyptostroboides



◆ Height 100' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 4

A deciduous, coniferous tree that grows in a conical shape. It features linear, feathery, fern-like foliage that is soft to the touch.

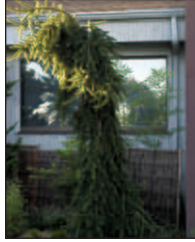


◆ Height 80' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 2

The fastest growing and largest of the spruce family. It has a pyramidal shape and branches become pendulous when it matures.

Weeping Norway Spruce

Picea abies 'Pendula'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 3

A slow growing conifer with graceful, weeping branches. Makes a unique specimen plant in landscape.

Black Hills Spruce

Picea glauca densata



◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 2

Dense symmetrical cone shape. Dark green foliage. Cold hardy, adaptable & resistant to winter injury. Medium growth rate. Requires little, if any, pruning. Deer resistant.

Cupressina Columnar Spruce

Picea abies 'Cupressina'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 4

A columnar variety of Norway Spruce with a slender, uniform growth habit and dense branching. It has bright green new growth that turns dark green.

Bush's Lace Engelmann Spruce

Picea engelmannii 'Bush's Lace'



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 4' ◆ Zone 3

This slow growing pyramidal is unique because it develops a strong central leader with all the branches cascading downward eventually creating a gray-blue skirt around the base of the tree. The effect is a graceful and glowing presence in the landscape.

Weeping White Spruce

Picea glauca 'Pendula'



◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 8' ◆ Zone 2

Narrow conical shape with pendulous branching to the ground. Bluish-green foliage emerges light green in spring. Hardy and highly adaptive to many environments.

Bird's Nest Spruce

Picea abies 'Nidiformis'



◆ Height 4' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

A spreading, low-growing, rounded conifer with a distinctly flat top or "nest". It has green foliage which emerges lime green in the spring.

White Spruce

Picea glauca

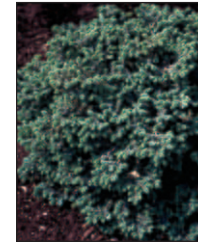


◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 2

Narrow conical form with green to blue green needles. Horizontally branching and are dense when young, becoming more loose and open with age. Used in landscape as a specimen, windbreak or a natural screen.

Blue Nest Spruce

Picea mariana nana



◆ Height 3' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 3

A slow growing globe-shaped spruce with a dense compact habit and blue-green foliage. This low maintenance shrub would make a great addition to any landscape as a specimen or a border. Prefers a sunny location and well-drained soil.

Royal Splendor® Norway Spruce

Picea abies 'Noel'



◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 3

The perfect permanent Christmas tree for your yard! The up-swept branches of this narrow growing pyramid sparkle with glossy emerald needles. Chosen as a superior seedling at the North Dakota State University Arboretum in Fargo.

Dwarf Alberta Spruce

Picea glauca conica



◆ Height 8' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 2

A dense, upright, pyramidal conifer with soft, light green needles. Excellent choice for a container or a specimen in a formal garden or landscape.

Serbian Spruce

Picea omorika



◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 4

Serbian spruce is a narrow, slow to moderate grower perfect for small sites and Asian gardens. It gives a two-tone look from the silvery undersides of its blue-green needles, which grow on pendulous branches. It is deer resistant and easy to care for.

Bruns Serbian Spruce

Picea omorika 'Bruns'

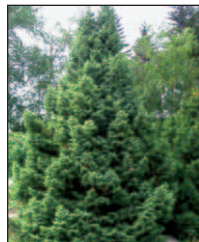


◆ Height 35' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 4

A narrow, upright spruce with a strong central leader. Blue-green needles have a silver-white band on the underside creating a two-toned effect. Good as a screen or a specimen for small landscapes. Full sun to partial shade and moist well-drained soil.

Dwarf Serbian Spruce

Picea omorika nana



◆ Height 6' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 4

Slow growing, dwarf conifer with green needles that are bluish-white on the underside giving it a two toned effect. Densely globe-shaped when young and takes a pyramidal shape as it ages. Full sun to partial shade with moist well-drained soil.

Colorado Green Spruce

Picea pungens



◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 3

Horizontal branches form a broad pyramid. Prefers dry soil. A hardy tree tolerant of many growing conditions. Green form of the species. Our trees are root-pruned to promote a full, tight top and fibrous root system.

Colorado Blue Spruce

Picea pungens glauca



◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 3

Very stiff, regular, horizontal branches form a broad pyramid. Blue form of the species. Prefers dry soil. A hardy tree tolerant of many growing conditions. Our trees are root-pruned in their liner beds before being transplanted into our grow-on fields. This promotes a full, tight top and ensures a fibrous root system.



'Sester Dwarf'® Spruce

Picea pungens glauca 'Sester Dwarf'®

◆ Height 11' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 2

A densely branched, conical shaped spruce with striking blue needles, 'Sester Dwarf'® is a slow growing dwarf conifer discovered by Gordon Sester (pictured above). This low maintenance pint-sized version of Colorado Blue Spruce is ideal for suburban landscapes.



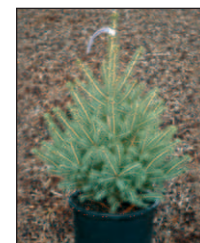

Colorado Spruce Mixed

Picea pungens (mix)



◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 3

These are selected from our liner beds of Colorado Spruce. We root-prune them in July, wait for them to push roots in the bed and then take them straight from the field, pot them; and by the time we ship them in the fall and spring, they're bursting with white roots in the container. A great cash and carry item at garden centers. Customers love them!

Baby Blue Spruce

Picea pungens 'Baby Blue'



◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 3

A much slower growing selection of Colorado Blue Spruce with extremely silver-blue needles. The eye catching foliage would make a beautiful specimen in gardens and landscapes with limited space.

Bacheri Spruce

Picea pungens 'Bacheri'



◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 2

Upright, very symmetrical evergreen conifer. Stiff horizontal branching forms a columnar pyramid. Deep, gray-blue needles. One of the best 'true blues'.

Blue Diamond Spruce

Picea pungens 'Blue Diamond'



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 3

A fragrant and exotic looking climbing vine with a compact growth habit. The flowers flush a soft pink to clear, light yellow all summer.

Persian Ironwood

Parrotia persica



◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 5

Prized for its unfolding reddish-purple leaves that turn a lustrous dark green shade in summer and brilliant orange, red and yellow colors in autumn. Interesting red flowers in the spring.

Pink Cloud Beauty Bush

Kolkwitzia amabilis 'Pink Cloud'

An ideal, deer resistant, accent border or screen plant. Small, light pink, funnel-shaped flowers cover arching stems mid to late spring. Flowers are followed by fluff covered seedheads amid elegant gray-green foliage on vase-shaped plants. Fall foliage color is reddish yellow.

Arnold Red Honeysuckle

Lonicera tatarica 'Arnold Red'

Upright, deciduous shrub. Has dark red, fragrant flowers in May followed by large, bright red berries in the summer.

Blizzard Mock Orange

Philadelphus lewisii 'Blizzard'

French Pussy Willow

Salix caprea



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 8' ◆ Zone 4
A multi-stemmed shrub grown for its early spring, silver grey catkins. Green summer leaves. Drought tolerant and fast growing.

Gro-Low Fragrant Sumac

Rhus aromatica 'Grow-Low'



◆ Height 2' ◆ Spread 9' ◆ Zone 3
A rugged, low growing, rambling shrub with shiny, mint green, pest resistant leaves which are not affected by drought, heat, humidity or snow plows. In October leaves turn brilliant, reddish-brown. Not invasive.

Variegated pink, white and green foliage fades to green as it matures. May be trimmed up to three times a season to flush the new variegated foliage.

Black Beauty™ Elderberry

Sambucus nigra 'Gerda'



◆ Height 8' ◆ Spread 8' ◆ Zone 3
Purple and black foliage. Bold 10" pink flower clusters in midsummer and dark purple, edible berries in late summer.

Crispa is distinctive because of its deeply serrated and sometimes twisted foliage. New leaves are red and fade to green with red tips. Late spring, early summer blooms are deep pink.



Froebel Spirea

Spiraea x bumalda 'Froebelii'

◆ Height 4' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

Wonderful easy care addition to your garden. Spring leaves burst out bronzy red, then in early summer the domed clusters of rose mauve flowers cover the shrub, and in fall leaves turn red wine hues. Froebel will bloom a bit all summer when you remove the fading flowers. Several planted together make an excellent low hedge. Survives heat, drought, city pollution, winter cold, any sort of soil, as well as deer, while at the same time attracting butterflies.



Goldflame Spirea

Spiraea x bumalda 'Goldflame'

◆ Height 3' ◆ Spread 3' ◆ Zone 3

Low growing shrub has bright yellow leaves that turn green in the summer then reddish orange in the fall. Blooms with beautiful pink-red flowers in the summer.



Goldmound Spirea

Spiraea x bumalda 'Goldmound'

◆ Height 2' ◆ Spread 3' ◆ Zone 4

Yellow foliage that turn slightly red in the fall. A low growing, bushy plant that blooms with pink flowers in the summer.



Renaissance Spirea

Spiraea x vanhouttei 'Renaissance'

◆ Height 5' ◆ Spread 7' ◆ Zone 3

An exciting remake of an old-fashioned favorite, featuring creamy white flowers held along loosely arching branches in spring. Better disease resistance and more compact than the original Vanhouttei spirea.



Indian Currant Coralberry

Symphocarpus orbicalatus

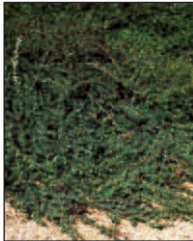

Syringa 'Bailbelle' PP12294

◆ Height 6' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

Upright compact deciduous shrub. Spectacular wine-red buds open to bright pink blooms with a spicy fragrance.



Thumbelina® Lilac

Syringa 'Baillina' PP16682

◆ Height 6' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

Multitudes of fragrant, very light pink blossoms. Makes an excellent hedge or specimen plant.



Miss Canada Lilac

◆ Height 6' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 3

Seiryu Japanese Maple

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Seiryu'

In the spring, this maple has stunning new growth. The new growth is variegated from pure white to bright pink, then fading to green.

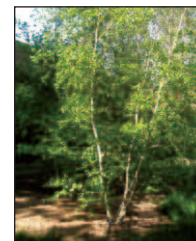

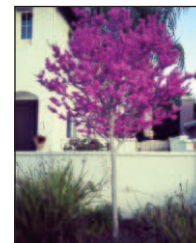

Ideal as an accent plant in any landscape.

Common Hackberry

Celtis occidentalis

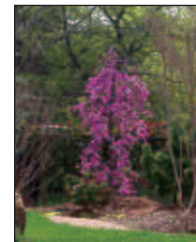

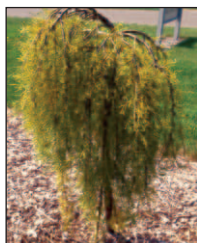

Katsura Tree

Cercidiphyllum japonicum

Lovely tall specimen for large lawns, features pretty blue-green heart shaped leaves that emerge reddish-purple in spring. Autumn brings shades of reddish-gold and apricot to the foliage which has the tantalizing scent of brown sugar and cinnamon as leaves fall. Insects and diseases seem to ignore the Katsura.

Forest Pansy Redbud

Cercis canadensis 'Forest Pansy'



◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 5

Colorful, ornamental tree with heart-shaped maroon-red leaves. In spring, purplish-pink flowers appear on branches. Good fall foliage color as well, from reds to purples.

Pyramidal European Hornbeam

Carpinus betulus 'Fastigiata'



◆ Height 35' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 5

A dense, compact, narrow crown becomes oval. Dark green foliage turns yellow in fall. Symmetrical and formal appearance. Heat and drought tolerant. Excellent for screening in tight areas.

Eastern Redbud

Cercis canadensis

Next scarlet-toned heart-shaped leaves emerge, transitioning to golden hues that are burn resistant even in the hot summer sun. Increased shade turns the foliage chartreuse green. Stays compact to fit in the smallest yards.

Oklahoma Redbud

Cercis canadensis 'Oklahoma'



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 6
Show-stopping magenta blossoms completely cover the branches of this small tree native to the mountains of Oklahoma. New leaves have a pink tint, become leathery, highly glossy green in summer, then turn varied shades of yellow with purple & orange. Even the short lavender seed pods provide attractive color as they cling to branches into winter.

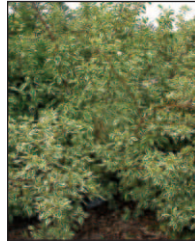

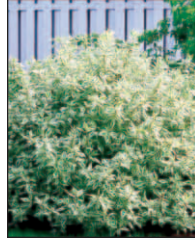

Upright small tree with variegated white and green foliage that contrasts well with red stems. In the spring, this tree blooms with clusters of creamy white flowers.

Ivory Halo™ Dogwood

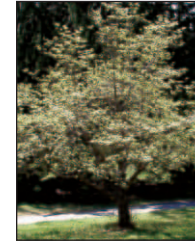

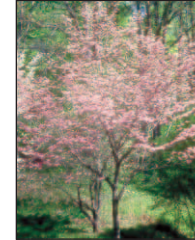

A low-branched tree, broadly pyramidal but somewhat flat-topped habit. Large white blooms in spring, towards the end of the blooming season the large green leaves have pink in the center of the leaf. This plant grows very fast. More resistant to powdery mildew than other Florida Dogwoods.

Milky Way Dogwood

Red raspberry-like fruits and pink and burgundy leaf color brighten up fall. Attracts songbirds, but not Bambi.

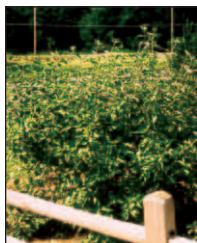

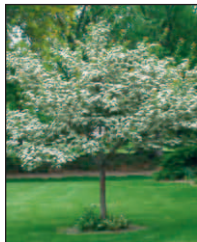

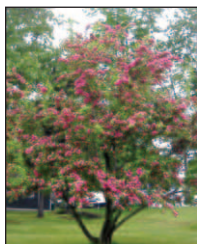

Single Seed Hawthorn

Crataegus monogyna

Grows easily in town, on the farm, or at the coast, in any sort of soil. This is the famous "May" tree of old English hedgerows. Planted to confine livestock and mark boundaries, today it discourages burglars. Tiny spherical white buds open to cream flowers in flat clusters (traditionally used as decor on Maypoles) followed by dark red Hawthorn berries, which feed songbirds and wildlife.

Washington Hawthorn

Crataegus phaenopyrum

Dark green leaves turn burgundy in the fall. Late blooming with abundant clusters of white flowers. Produces small clusters of red fruit in early autumn. Good food source for birds.

Winter King Green Hawthorn

Crataegus viridis 'Winter King'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 4

Glossy green leaves turn purplish-red in the fall. Clusters of white flowers in the spring. Produces small red fruit persists throughout the winter. Good food source for birds.

Dawcyk Purple Beech

Fagus sylvatica 'Dawcyk Purple'



◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 4

Upright, columnar habit. Foliage emerges coppery bronze in the spring turning a deep purple in the summer and then coppery bronze in the fall.

Purple Fountain Beech

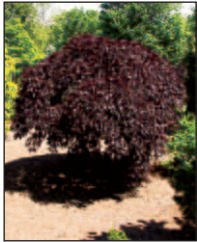

◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 5
Cascading, columnar form with a defined leader. Leaves emerge burgundy in spring and become more green as they mature. Yellow-coppery fall color.

Weeping Purple Beech

Fagus sylvatica 'Purpurea Pendula'



◆ Height 10' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 4
A weeping beech with dark purple foliage turning copper in fall. Smaller than other beech varieties, it is more of a shrub than a tree. The branches sweep up and away from the center of the tree forming a mound of foliage. It is usually not trained to a central leader but can be trained this way to create a tree-type look. It makes a fine specimen for small landscapes.

Rivers Purple Beech

Fagus sylvatica 'Riversii'

This magnificent shade tree has topped the Purple Beech charts since 1860 and deservedly so. The leaves emerge a stunning deep dark purple, turn a bronzed purple green in summer, and finally a rich copper red in autumn. Even its smooth silver-gray bark has been said to resemble an elephant's hide. Give it's branches room to spread and it will grow into a wonderful specimen.

Tricolor European Beech

Fagus sylvatica 'Roseo-marginata'



◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 5
Broadly oval form with deep burgundy red leaves that have pinkish-white and rose margins that turn coppery bronze in the fall.

Spaeth's Purple Beech

Fagus sylvatica 'Spaethii'

Slightly smaller than the massive River's Beech, Spaeth's Purple is prized for wavy edged, dark maroon leaves that hold their deep color through most of the summer. Autumn Purple® Ash

Fraxinus americana 'Junginger'

Raywood Ash

Fraxinus oxycarpa 'Raywood'



◆ Height 45' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 6
The best Ash to plant! Beautiful tree with fine-textured, almost lacy, dark green leaflets which give refreshing light shade, and turn a stunning rich red-purple in autumn. Fast growing when young, it slows down and won't outgrow its space. Deer and disease resistant, no messy seeds, and even grows in desert climates.

Cimmaron® Ash

Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Cimzam'



◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 4
Grown for its attractive foliage, this ash features thick, waxy green leaves that turn a beautiful brick-red to orange-red in autumn. Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Heuver' PP13262

Extremely winter-hardy ash was discovered near Calgary, Alberta, home to one of the harshest climates in North America. Vigorous and easy to care for, it will grow well in the toughest locations. Glossy green leaves turn an outstanding yellow in autumn. Seedless.

Patmore Ash

Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Patmore'



◆ Height 45' ◆ Spread 35' ◆ Zone 3
Symmetrical, oval crown. Upright branching. Narrow, uniform leaves. Glossy, dark green foliage that turns yellow in the fall. Seedless. Disease and insect resistant. Highly adaptable.

Prairie Spire® Ash

Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Rugby'

Tulip Tree

Liriodendron tulipifera

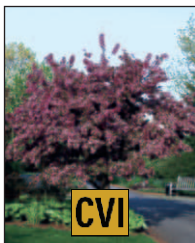

Crown is broad and round. New leaves emerge red-purple, and mature to bronze-green. Flowers are single, deep pink which are followed by dark red fruit.

Starlite™ Crabapple

Malus 'Jeflite'



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 2
Upright shape with outstanding resistance to apple scab. Pretty white flowers in the spring.

Perfect Purple Crabapple

Malus 'Perfect Purple'



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 3
You will understand where Perfect Purple's name comes from when you see the bright, deep purple leaves and the tiny plum-purple apples. Just as exciting are the glowing dark rosy-pink flowers that fragrantly crown the rounded canopy. Neither cold winters nor urban conditions faze it, and it is very resistant to mildew.

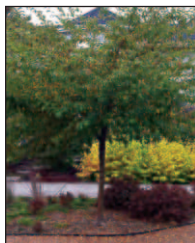

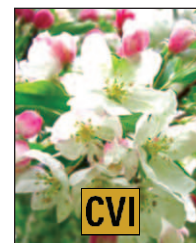

Royal Raindrops® Crabapple

Malus transitoria 'JFS-KWS'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 4
Upright, spreading form. Pink-red blossoms in the spring followed by small red fruit. Purple cut leaf foliage that turns orange-red in fall. Disease resistance.

Firebird® Crabapple

Malus sargentii 'Select A' PP12621



◆ Height 8' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 4
Compact ornamental for a small garden features distinctive horizontally tiered branches. Rose-red buds open to masses of fragrant white blossoms, followed by an abundance of red-orange crabapples which darken to a flamboyant red. Fruits stay on the tree through late winter, providing tasty treats for migrating songbirds and showy color against snow laden landscapes.

Spring Snow Crabapple

Malus 'Spring Snow'



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 22' ◆ Zone 3
Dense, oval crown. Medium green foliage. Abundance of dreamy, pure white blossoms in spring. No fruit.

Weeping Candied Apple® Crabapple

Malus 'Weepcanzam'



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 4
This trees weeping branches are covered in brilliant pinkish-red blooms in spring. In the fall the red fruit attracts the birds.

Gladiator™ Crabapple

Malus x adstringens 'Durple' PP20167



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 2

Stately and narrow with lustrous bronze-purple leaves, this crabapple always looks good, especially when blooming with fragrant deep pink flowers. Miniature reddish-purple apples follow. Developed in Manitoba to be tough, prairie and city hardy.

Center Glow® Ninebark

Physocarpus opulifolius 'Center Glow'



◆ Height 7' ◆ Spread 7' ◆ Zone 3

A mounded, vase-shaped ninebark cultivar most noted for its attractive foliage. Leaves emerge greenish-gold in spring and age to burgundy while showing both colors as they mature. Pinkish-white summer flowers form dense, flat clusters. The bark peels in strips to reveal attractive, reddish-brown inner bark.

London Planetree

Platanus acerfolia 'Bloodgood'



◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 5

Maple-like foliage is medium to dark green. Vigorous. Broadly pyramidal crown. Shedding bark is olive to cream. Choice tree for commercial landscapes. Fall color is yellow. Resistant to anthracnose. Tolerant of most soils and air pollution.

Chaparral Weeping Mulberry

Morus alba 'Chaparral'



◆ Height 8' ◆ Spread 12' ◆ Zone 4

A dwarf selection that has cascading branches and weeping foliage. It generally has a greater spread than height and is fruitless.

Dart's Gold Ninebark

Physocarpus opulifolius 'Dart's Gold'



◆ Height 5' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 2

Bright yellow leaves in spring, turning lime green in summer. White flowers. Very adaptable.

Exclamation!™ London Planetree

Platanus x acerfolia 'Morton Circle'

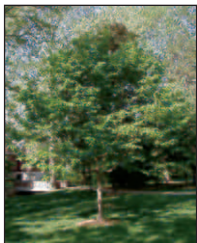


◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 5

Vigorous growing with a uniform upright pyramidal form and a strong central leader. Green leaves turn yellow in the fall. Develops exfoliating bark that is mottled brown, green, and tan that peels off to reveal patches of cream to white interior bark. Resistant to frost cracking and anthracnose.

American Hophornbeam

Ostrya virginiana



◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 3

Hanging hop-like clusters of seed pods adorn this native tree all summer, aging from green to tan. Good looking and maintenance-free, it survives dry rocky soil, ice, wind, and difficult inner city environments. Bark develops narrow vertical strips as it matures.

Diabolo® Ninebark

Physocarpus opulifolius 'Monlo'



◆ Height 10' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 2

Red-purple foliage. Has clusters of creamy white blooms in early summer that turn to red fruits. Exfoliating mature bark.

White Poplar

Populus alba



◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 3

Dark green leaves. Silvery gray and woolly underneath. Bud and twigs covered with short white hairs. Bark becomes rough and dark with age. Fast growing.

Persian Ironwood

Parrotia persica



◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 5

The Persian Parrotia is a slow-growing deciduous tree prized for its unfolding reddish-purple leaves that turn a lustrous dark green shade in summer and brilliant orange, red and yellow colors in autumn. In winter, the attractive peeling bark, the well-branched canopy and the multiple trunks are quite a sight in the landscape. Interesting red flowers in the spring.

Summer Wine® Ninebark

Physocarpus opulifolius 'Seward' PP14821



◆ Height 6' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 3

Plant combines the fine texture and compact branching of Physocarpus Nana with the dark foliage of Physocarpus Diabolo. Smaller than other ninebark varieties, it's easy to grow and rarely needs pruning. Foliage is fine, deeply cut and dark crimson with deepest color when in full sun. Use as a bold accent or part of a mixed border. In early spring blooms pinkish-white, button flowers. Also features exfoliating bark and red fruit in fall.

Narrowleaf Poplar

Populus angustifolia



◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 45' ◆ Zone 3

Perfect choice for planting near a stream or pond, especially in dry hilly or prairie locations. Tall and slim with willow-like leaves turning golden yellow in autumn. Offers excellent habitat for birds, wildlife and butterflies. Sometimes called the Narrowleaf Cottonwood.

Siouxland Poplar

Populus deltoides 'Siouxland'



◆ Height 75' ◆ Spread 35' ◆ Zone 2

Oval shape, medium green foliage that turns yellow in the fall. Seedless. A very fast growing tree with resistance to leaf rust.

Theves Poplar

Populus nigra 'Afghanica'



◆ Height 55' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 4

Upright, spire-like crown with medium green foliage. Turns yellow in fall. Fast growth. Used as wind break or large hedge. Resistant to canker.

Swedish Aspen

Populus tremula 'Erecta'



◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 2

Upright, narrow crown. Medium green foliage. Turns yellow-orange-red in fall. Well adapted to cold. A good substitute for Lombardy Poplar. Seedless.

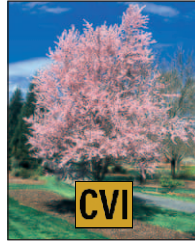

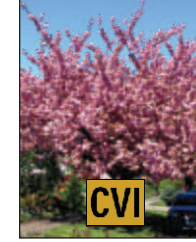

Stiffly vase-shaped crown with dark green foliage that turns bronze-orange-red in fall. The new growth in spring is a bronzy red. Showy double, rosy pink flowers in clusters, last longer than those of other flowering cherries. Hardy.

Crimson Pointe® Columnar Plum

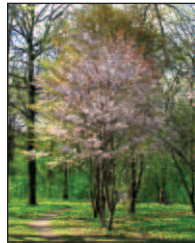
Prunus cerasifera 'Cripozam' PP19564



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 4
Very slim columnar tree. New growth is orange-bronze that turns to a deep burgundy red. White flowers in early spring.

Little Twist® Fuji Cherry

Prunus incisa 'CarltonLT'



◆ Height 8' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 5
A unique petite cherry tree, Little Twist is a sure conversation piece. The twisted twigs create an unusual form that is covered in spring with copious clusters of dancing white bell-shaped blooms featuring a pink center. Autumn leaf display ranges from bright orange to burgundy. Even in winter the zigzag branches of this tiny gem provide interest.

Royal Burgundy Cherry

Prunus serrulata 'Royal Burgundy'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 5
Divine flowering cherry with deep rose-pink double blossoms similar to 'Kwanzan' but with the added bonus of dark wine-purple foliage. The combination of frilly pink blooms with burgundy leaves makes an arresting display. In autumn leaves turn a fiery bronze. A great small shade tree in a well-drained location.

Krauter Vesuvius Plum

Prunus cerasifera 'Krauter Vesuvius'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 5
Noted for deep purple foliage through summer with light pink flowers. A little darker than 'Thundercloud' and a little smaller and more upright.

Goldspur® Amur Chokecherry

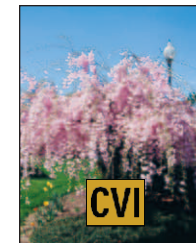
Prunus maackii 'Jefspur'



◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 9' ◆ Zone 2
A dwarf selection of Amur cherry combining an upright growth habit with flaky, golden bark and dense, dark green foliage. Creamy, white spring flowers produce tiny, black, summer fruit. Golden, exfoliating bark is a desirable winter feature.

Double Weeping Cherry

Prunus subhirtella 'Pendula Plena Rosea'



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 5
Medium tree with pendulous oval growth becoming mounding with maturity. Dark, green leaves turn yellow-bronze in fall. Blooms mid-spring with double, rose-pink flowers. Adaptable to poor soils.

Newport Flowering Plum

Prunus cerasifera 'Newport'



◆ Height 20' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 3
Upright, spreading tree. Broadly oval to rounded top. Purple-red foliage turns reddish in fall. Flowers are pale pink. Hardier than 'Thundercloud'.

Sargent Flowering Cherry

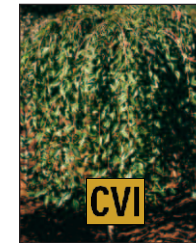
Prunus sargentii



◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 4
One of the most cold hardy of the flowering cherries & lives longer than other types. The black fruit is quite small, making the tree less messy. Its yellow & orange fall color add interest at the end of the season. Pink to white flowers in spring.

Snow Fountains® Cherry

Prunus subhirtella 'Snofozam'



◆ Height 12' ◆ Spread 12' ◆ Zone 5
Abundant white, single blossoms on weeping branches. Small, dark green leaves turn golden orange in fall. Good choice for smaller landscapes.

Nanking Cherry

Prunus tomentosa



◆ Height 10' ◆ Spread 7' ◆ Zone 3

In early spring the Nanking Cherry produces showy pinkish white flowers. Has an edible, red fruit that ripens in June-July. A very cold hardy and drought tolerant shrub.

Spire Flowering Cherry

Prunus x hillieri 'Spire'

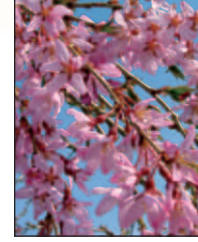


◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 12' ◆ Zone 5

Ornamental tree which grows slenderly upright, making it ideal for a narrow space or along an avenue. The froth of soft pink springtime flowers bloom just as the purplish-bronze leaves appear, creating pleasing contrast. The foliage stays bronze, then turns refreshing green, finally putting on an autumn display of bright orange, red and bronze. Low maintenance.

Pink Snow Showers™ Cherry

Prunus x 'Pisnshzam'

Prunus virginiana 'Schubert'



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 2

Pyramidal, rounded head with dense foliage, green at first turning to red-purple as the leaf matures. Tiny white flowers appear in spring. Astringent fruit is dark purple. Leaves turn red-purple in fall. Easily grown. Hardy.

Okame Cherry

Prunus x incam 'Okame'

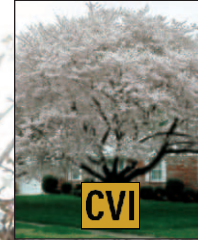

Very early blooming cultivar with brightly colored flower bud and calyx with iridescent hot rosy pink blooms. Oval shape with upright branching.

Yoshino Flowering Cherry

Prunus x yedoensis



◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 5

Medium green foliage with yellow fall color. Gorgeous display of white-pink flowers in the spring. Small black fruit attracts birds. Featured tree of the National Cherry Blossom Festival in Washington, D.C.

Canada Red Select Chokecherry

Prunus virginiana 'Schubert Select'



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 2

Selected for its vigorous growth, straight trunk, and uniform top. Leaves are darker than the regular Canada Red.

Purpleleaf Sand Cherry

Prunus x cistena



◆ Height 8' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 3

Upright, oval shaped shrub. Has fragrant, pink flowers in spring and purple-red foliage. Very hardy.

Aristocrat® Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Aristocrat' PP3193

◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 28' ◆ Zone 4

Pyramidal but open crown. Dark green foliage turns rich red. White flowers. Strong branches with wide crotch angles. Resistant to wind and storm damage.



New Bradford® Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Holmford'

◆ Height 35' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 5

A callery pear with improved branching structure which reduces storm and winter damage and is very resistant to fire blight. Before the glossy green leaves appear, it is covered in masses of white flowers. In fall the foliage turns orange to maroon. In spring it is covered with clusters of white flowers. It is widely adaptable to different soil types, is drought tolerant and disease resistant.



Autumn Blaze Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Autumn Blaze'

◆ Height 30' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 4

This flowering pear is truly a 3-season champion. Spring brings a dense mass of thousands of white flowers, and its spreading branches and glossy dark green leaves form a shady summer canopy. In early fall the foliage turns a blazing crimson red. Tolerant of clay soil, dry heat, pollution and drought, it is a great choice for parking lot plantings.



Jack® Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Jaczam'

◆ Height 16' ◆ Spread 10' ◆ Zone 4

A dwarf pear with an upright, oval shape. Blooms in early spring with large, white flowers.



Capital Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Capital'

◆ Height 35' ◆ Spread 12' ◆ Zone 5

Narrow, columnar shape. In early spring, blooms with clusters of white flowers. Glossy, green leaves turn purple-red in fall.



Lil' Jill™ Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Liljilzam'

◆ Height 15' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 4

A dwarf pear, excellent for small planting space. It is a standout with shiny, crisp green foliage. The new growth emerges with tinted bronze pink tones.



Chanticleer® Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Glen's Form'

◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 4

Narrow, but not columnar. Leaves broadly oval, scalloped, dark green and very glossy. Flowers clustered, pure white. Very early bloom. Disease resistant. Rich purple-red fall color.



Redspire Pear

Pyrus calleryana 'Redspire'

◆ Height 35' ◆ Spread 25' ◆ Zone 5

This plant is a great street tree with a pyramidal form. Large clusters of white flowers fill this tree in the spring. In the fall the foliage turns crimson and purple. Fire blight resistant.



Swamp White Oak

Quercus bicolor

◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 4

A native tree with beautiful two-toned lobed leaves that are dark green atop a silvery-white underside. Does well in wet areas.



Scarlet Oak

Quercus coccinea

◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 4

Symmetrical crown becomes round, open and spreading with age. Shiny, dark green leaves turn dazzling scarlet color in fall. Rapid growth rate. Medium to coarse texture.



Northern Pin Oak

Quercus ellipsoidalis

◆ Height 55' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 3

Broad, oval shape. Glossy green foliage turns a spectacular red color in the fall. Excellent tree for restoration projects of native habitats.



Shingle Oak

Quercus imbricaria

◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 50' ◆ Zone 5

Stately medium-sized deciduous oak with a crown broadening and rounding with age. Large glossy oblong leaves start with a red to yellow cast, deepen to rich green through summer then turn shades of yellow and rust in the fall before dropping. Drooping yellowish-green catkin flowers appear early spring followed by dark brown acorns. Called Shingle Oak because pioneers used the wood, which splits easily, for shingles.



Bur Oak

Quercus macrocarpa

◆ Height 55' ◆ Spread 45' ◆ Zone 3

Large tree with a pyramidal to oval crown. Massive, pillar-like trunk and long, twisted branches. Adaptable. Leaf color is a beautiful dark green in summer changing to yellow-green in fall.



Pin Oak

Quercus palustris

◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 40' ◆ Zone 4

This tree has a very distinctive growth habit. It maintains a strong central leader, and has long slender horizontally layered branches.



Columnar English Oak

Quercus robur 'Fastigiata'

◆ Height 60' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 4

A columnar form of English Oak. This is an uncommon variety of a great tree. Slow-growing, narrow, upright growth habit.



Kindred Spirit® Columnar Oak

Quercus robur fastigiata x bicolor 'Nadler' PP17604

◆ Height 35' ◆ Spread 6' ◆ Zone 4

This new hybrid of English and swamp oak is full of promise with its narrow columnar habit, mildew and drought resistance, and tolerance of city conditions. It is the narrowest of all the columnar oaks so far, with medium green foliage turning yellow to yellow-brown in autumn.

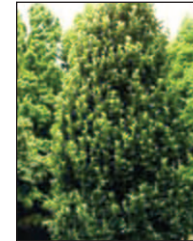


Regal Prince® Columnar Oak

Quercus robur fastigiata x bicolor 'Long' PP12673

◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 20' ◆ Zone 4

This is a cross of *Q. robur fastigiata* (Upright English Oak) and *Q. bicolor* (Swamp White Oak) with an upright oval habit which is very distinctive. Its mildew-resistant foliage is glossy, with a bright green color.



Heritage® Oak

Quercus robur x macrocarpa 'Clemons'

◆ Height 80' ◆ Spread 50' ◆ Zone 3

This hybrid English oak is a vigorous grower which is unusual for an oak. Expect 2'-4' of growth per year once established. The green leaves are broad, pyramidal shaped and glossy. In autumn these leaves turn yellow to yellow-brown and it produces acorns. The foliage is extremely resistant to tatter and powdery mildew. This large shade tree is one of the best oaks to use in high pH soils and is resistant to diseases.



Red Oak

Quercus rubra

◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 45' ◆ Zone 4

Symmetrical crown that is broad and rounded, nearly as wide as it is tall. Vibrant, dark green leaves that turn a deep red in autumn. This is a large and fast growing tree.



Shumard Oak

Quercus shumardii

◆ Height 40' ◆ Spread 30' ◆ Zone 5

This magnificent oak grows into a large stately tree with a narrow, somewhat open, rounded canopy. The deeply lobed green leaves take on a vivid red to orange-red color in fall, persisting on the branches for most of the cold season. It grows well in full sun and adapts to a wide variety of soils, wet or dry, but will grow much faster on moist rich soils.



Black Locust

Robinia pseudoacacia



◆ Height ◆ Spread ◆ Zone 3

This fast growing deciduous tree produces wonderfully fragrant white flowers borne in hanging wisteria-like clusters followed by long seed pods that attract wildlife. Blue-green foliage turns an attractive yellow in the fall. The upright growth and the short irregular branches form an oval crown that casts light shade. Adaptable to different soil texture and pH; tolerates salt and drought.

Twisty Baby® Locust

Robinia pseudoacacia 'Lace Lady' PP9771



◆ Height 25' ◆ Spread 15' ◆ Zone 4

Twisted, irregularly spreading branches. Unusual outline, especially in winter. Zigzag branching. Leaves are dark green. Some curling of mature leaflets. Turns yellow in fall.

Purple Robe Locust

Robinia pseudoacacia 'Purple Robe'



◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 32' ◆ Zone 3

Medium tree with compact, rounded crown. Dark blue-green leaves. Showy, pea-like, pendulous, pink flowers. (Pictured right)

Coral Embers Willow

Salix alba 'Britzensis'



◆ Height 5' ◆ Spread 4' ◆ Zone 2

Got a damp spot in your yard that looks dull in winter? Here's your solution! Coral Embers' glowing red-orange branches brighten dreary or snowy winter landscapes, and they love having wet feet. Makes a great deer-resistant screen or hedge. Cut back in late winter for best color. Sometimes called the Coral Bark Willow.

Golden Weeping Willow

Salix alba 'Tristis'



◆ Height 50' ◆ Spread 60' ◆ Zone 4

Famously admired and romantic Weeping Willow of sweeping landscapes with lakes or streams, this fast-growing elegant tree needs room to roam. The golden, pendulous branchlets turn even brighter yellow in winter. Give it a damp spot or plant next to a pond, but keep it away from sewers or drains. Hardier to cold temperatures than other varieties.

Curly Locks Willow

Salix caprea 'Curly Locks'



◆ Height 5' ◆ Spread 5' ◆ Zone 4

Fascinating compact weeper boasts arching, twisting branches and curling leaves. Branches with silky, silvery white 'pussy willow' catkins are wonderful in floral arrangements. Ideal sculptural tree for small gardens, works well in a pot on the patio, even on city apartment balconies, since it is urban tolerant.

Weeping Pussy Willow

Salix caprea 'Pendula'

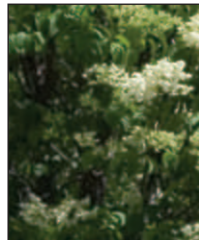

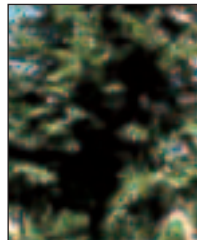

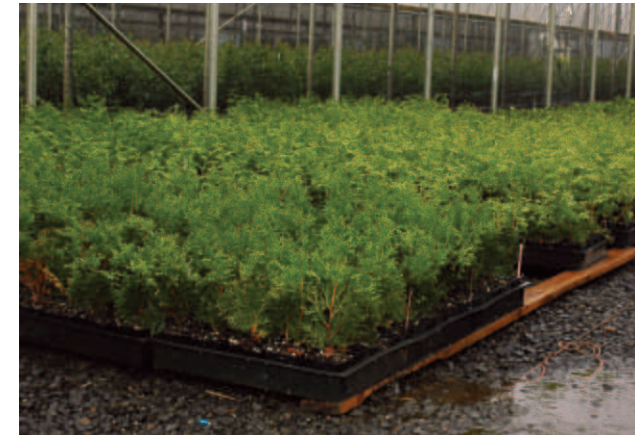
